
Tangrams

Tangrams are a fun puzzle that comes from China, created during the late Qing dynasty, around the early 1800s. In Chinese, it's called qīqiǎobǎn (七巧板), which means "seven clever pieces." The puzzle has seven flat geometric shapes, called tans, that you can move around to make all kinds of pictures—like animals, people, or boats. People all over the world have loved tangrams for a long time. They're a fun way to use your imagination, solve puzzles, and learn how shapes and geometry work!


